### About REAP

REAP Central Plateau is a not-for-profit organisation that delivers a variety of personalised education and whānau focused programmes and services throughout the Central Plateau region.

Our programmes cover a wide range of kaupapa including early childhood, schooling, learning support, rangatahi mentoring, adult literacy and numeracy, and community education. We operate our own ISP (Internet Service Provider) to support connectivity in remote areas.

The aim of REAP is to advance community development through quality lifelong education in rural Aotearoa. As one of 13 REAPs nationwide, our purpose is to redress the disadvantages experienced by rural communities in accessing the range and depth of activities and services enjoyed by those who live in urban areas.



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### Te Tiriti o Waitangi

REAP Central Plateau acknowledges Te Tiriti o Waitangi as the founding document of Aotearoa. Our organisation is committed to the spirit of partnership, protection, and participation the Treaty engenders by maintaining its principles throughout our philosophies, values, policies and actions.

We are committed to the principles of Te Tiriti and understand that the principles reflect the importance of Māori self-determination, equitable outcomes for Māori, and respect for Māori worldviews and beliefs.

At REAP Central Plateau, we aim to demonstrate Treaty-based values and practices in a range of ways, including:

- Nurturing collaborative partnerships with Iwi, hapū and marae.
- Valuing Te Reo me ona tikanga as part of our everyday practice.
- · Considering Te Ao Māori (Māori worldview) in our planning and activities across the sectors.
- $\cdot$  Supporting our team to grow in their knowledge and understanding of Te Tiriti.

## Principles

### At REAP Central Plateau we are committed to the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi:

#### Article 1: Kāwanatanga: honourable governance for mutual benefit

Our processes, actions, decision-making and delivery of services are informed and shaped equally by Tangata Whenua and Tangata Tiriti worldviews and perspectives.

#### Article 2: Tino Rangatiratanga: Māori self-determination/sovereignty

We recognise the importance of Tangata Whenua authority and autonomy and take active steps to support Tangata Whenua led processes, actions and decision-making.

#### Article 3: Ōritetanga: equity for Māori

We undertake specific actions to ensure equitable outcomes for Tangata Whenua.

#### Article 4: Wairuatanga: upholding belief systems

Tangata Whenua worldviews, values and wairuatanga are respected in our work.


